Hebrew Rehabilitation Center Names Two New Vice Presidents in Time of Unprecedented Growth

BOSTON—Hebrew Rehabilitation Center, the flagship health-care provider of Hebrew SeniorLife, a leader in senior care and an affiliate of Harvard Medical School, has promoted two longtime health-care administrators to vice president positions. The promotions are part of a management reorganization at a time of unprecedented growth in HRC's health-care services, including the opening of long-term and sub-acute care units at NewBridge on the Charles in Dedham.

Lisa Cappuccilli, R.N., M.A., L.N.C., an experienced nursing executive, has been named vice president for Nursing and Resident- and Family-Centered Care at Hebrew Rehabilitation Center in Roslindale. She oversees all nursing operations, including long-term care, rehabilitation services, social services, recreation therapy, creative arts therapy, and volunteers, and is also responsible for implementing elements of a new resident-centered model of care at HRC. She also works in collaboration with and provides support to the nursing leadership at Hebrew Rehabilitation Center at NewBridge on the Charles.

Prior to joining HRC in 2008 as chief nursing officer, Ms. Cappuccilli was vice president of nursing at Vinfen Corporation, a private, nonprofit human services organization that provides services to adults and children with mental illnesses. She has held senior nursing positions with Commonwealth Communities, where she implemented neurobehavioral programs, started a homecare division, and provided clinical oversight to numerous campuses, and Golden Pond Assisted Living in Hopkinton, where she implemented a geriatric psychiatry program within the assisted living facility and expanded the home health-care division. She is certified in both Massachusetts and New Hampshire as a legal nurse consultant. She earned her nursing degree from Boston College and her master's from Rhode Island College. She resides in Marshfield.

Scott Ariel has been named vice president for Post-acute, Ancillary and Support Services at Hebrew Rehabilitation Center in Roslindale. He oversees a wide range of services, including respiratory therapy, pharmacy, radiology, laboratory, case management, food services, and housekeeping, as well as two post-acute care units. He is also responsible for CARF (Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities) preparations and accreditation for the sub-acute care units on both campuses of Hebrew Rehabilitation Center, as well as compliance with state and federal regulations for the pharmacy, radiology and laboratory services at HRC at NewBridge.

An accomplished health-care executive with more than 25 years of experience, Mr. Ariel joined HSL as a consultant in 2007 and served as the administrator of its post-acute care units until his promotion. He previously served as chief operating officer of Kindred Hospital Northeast Braintree, where he helped achieve the highest occupancy rates in the organization's history. He has served in marketing and administrative capacities at Boston-
