Funny Girl (1968) G 2h 31m The life of Fanny Brice, famed comedienne and entertainer of the early 1900s. We see her rise to fame as a Ziegfeld girl, subsequent career, and her personal life, particularly her relationship with Nick Arnstein. *Barbra Streisand.*

Sunday, March 1 – 7:30
Downton Abbey (2019) PG 2h 2m The continuing story of the Crawley family, wealthy owners of a large estate in the English countryside in the early twentieth century. *Maggie Smith.*

Tuesday, March 3 – 7:30
Thelma (2017) NR 1h 56m A confused religious girl tries to deny her feelings for a female friend who's in love with her. This causes her suppressed subconsciously-controlled psychokinetic powers to reemerge with devastating results. *Henrik Rafaelsen.*

Shadow (2018) NR 1h 56m To finally achieve victory over a rival kingdom, a brilliant general devises an intricate plan involving his wife, a look-alike and two kings. *Chao Deng.*

Monday, March 16 – 7:30
What Happened Miss Simone (2015) NR 1h 41m Classically trained pianist, dive-bar chanteuse, black power icon and legendary recording artist Nina Simone lived a life of brutal honesty, musical genius, and tortured melancholy. Documentary.

Honey Boy (2019) R 1h 34m When 12-year-old Otis begins to find success as a television star, his abusive, alcoholic father returns and takes over as his guardian, and their contentious relationship is followed over a decade. *Shia LaBeouf.*

Saturday, March 21 – 1:30
The Squid and the Whale (2005) R 1h 28m Follows two young boys dealing with their parents' divorce in Brooklyn in the 1980s. *Jesse Eisenberg.*

Saturday, March 21 – 7:30
Judy (2019) PG-13 1h 58m Legendary performer Judy Garland (Renée Zellweger) arrives in London in the winter of 1968 to perform a series of sold-out concerts. *Renee Zellweger.*

Sunday, March 22 – 7:30
Okja (2017) NR 2h A young girl risks everything to prevent a powerful, multinational company from kidnapping her best friend - a fascinating beast named Okja. *Tilda Swinton.*

Monday, March 23 – 7:30
At Eternity's Gate (2018) PG-13 1h 51m Famed but tormented artist Vincent van Gogh spends his final years in Arles, France, painting masterworks of the natural world that surrounds him. *William DaFoe.*

In Fabric (2019) R 1h 58m A lonely divorcee visits a bewitching London department store to find a dress to transform her life. She soon finds a perfect, artery-red gown that unleashes a malevolent, unstoppable curse. *Julian Barratt.*

Sunday, March 29 – 7:30
Richard Jewell (2019) R 2h 11m American security guard Richard Jewell saves thousands of lives from an exploding bomb at the 1996 Olympics, but is vilified by journalists and the press who falsely reported that he was a terrorist. *Sam Rockwell.*

The Big Sick (2017) R 2h Pakistan-born comedian Kumail Nanjiani and grad student Emily Gardner fall in love but struggle as their cultures clash.
