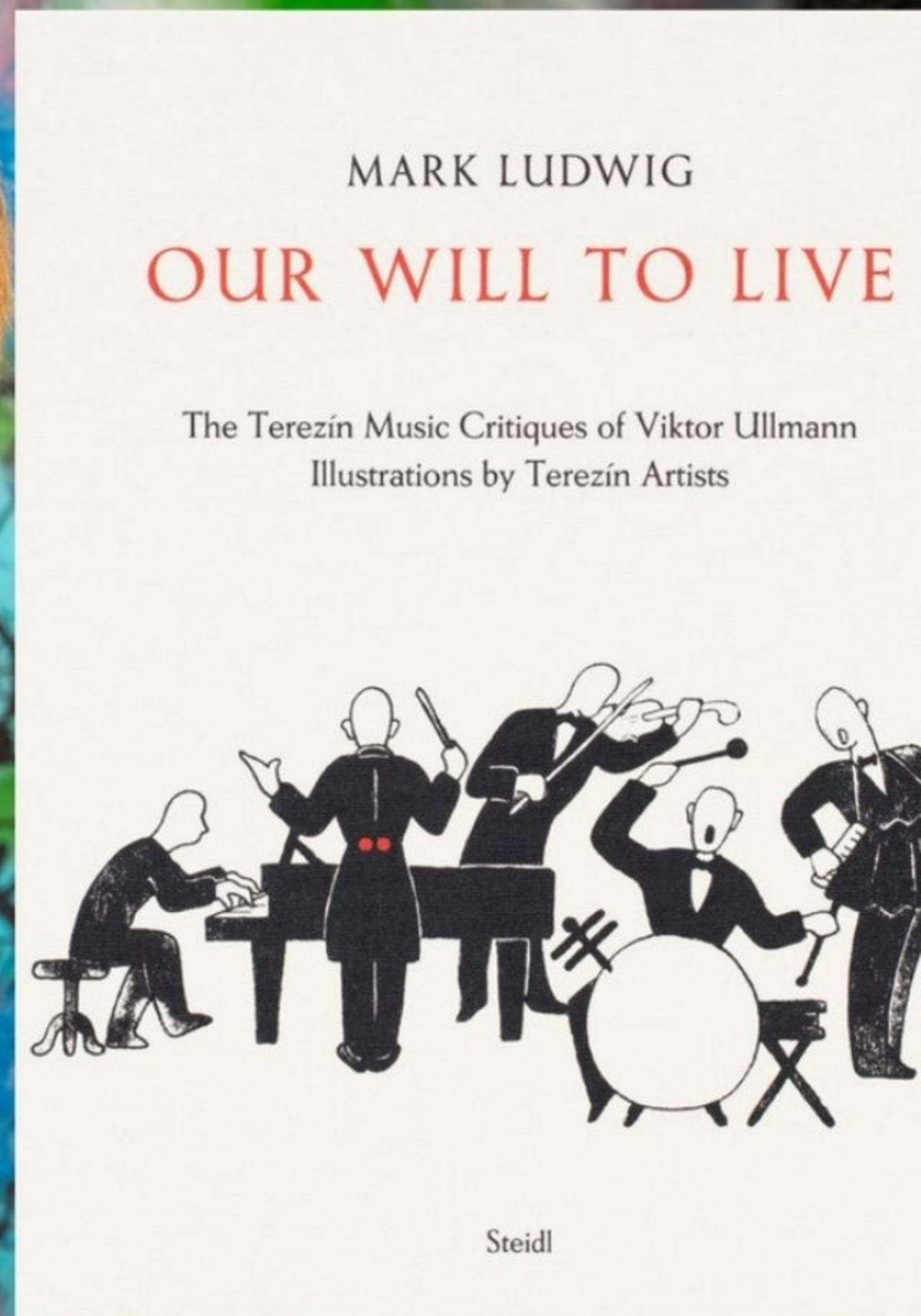

Who Is Vladimir Putin?

IGOR LUKES, PROF OF HISTORY &
INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS, BOSTON UNIVERSITY

The talk introduces Vladimir Putin and seeks to identify moments in his past that formed him to be the man he is today. We'll talk about his youth in postwar Leningrad, his service in the KGB in East Germany, his return to the Soviet Union when it was falling apart.

The focus is on terrorist attacks on civilian targets in 1999 and Putin's popularity among western politicians. Finally, we'll discuss the collapse of hopes that Russia could become a reliable ally for western democracies.

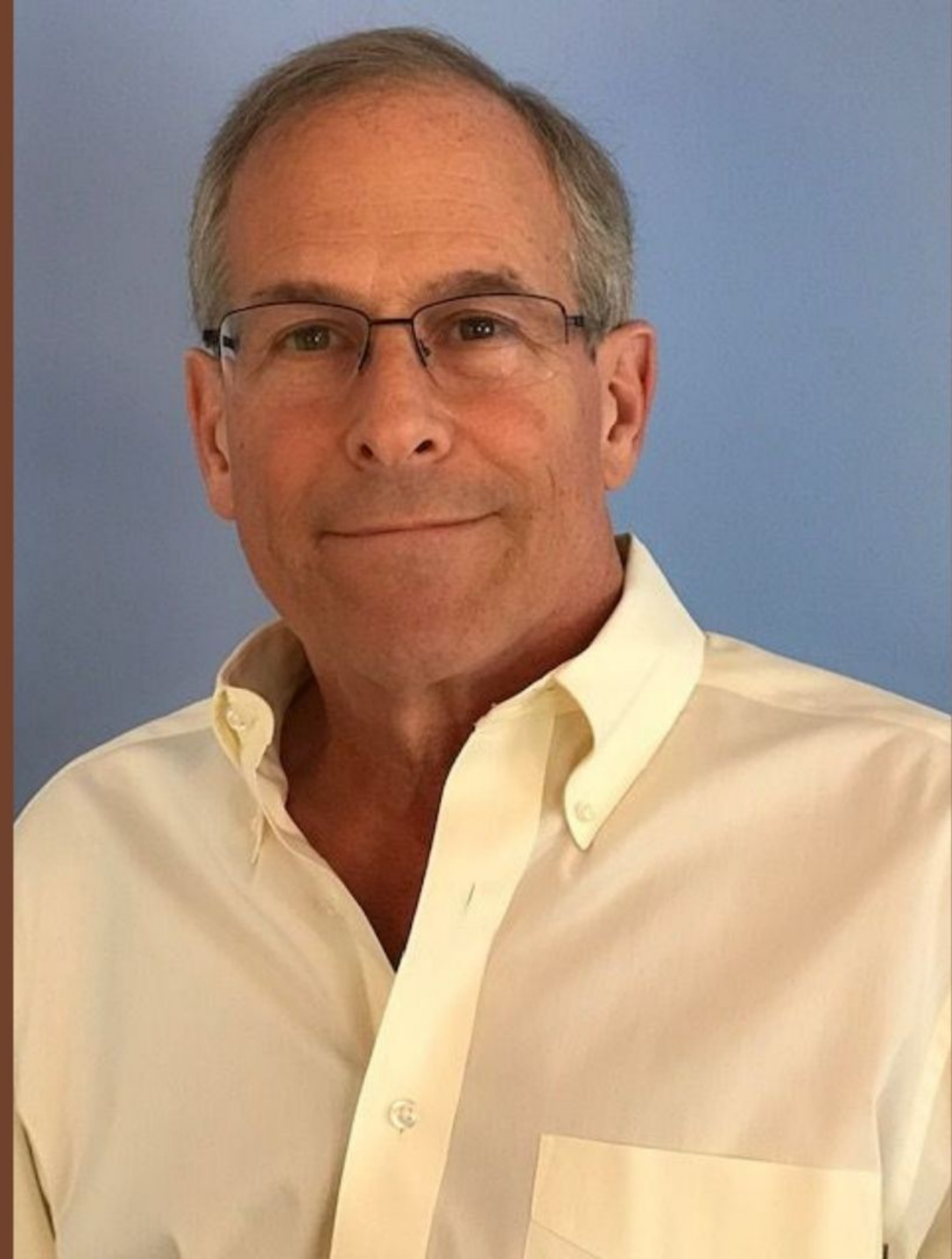
