

Giving Care a Heart: How Philanthropy Makes a Difference

Philanthropy is the lifeblood of institutions like Hebrew Senior Life, and the Bilingual Russian Program, in particular. It enables the Program to go beyond basic care, covered by Medicare and Medicaid, ensuring that patients live with dignity, purpose, and in connection to their heritage. Specifically in the Jewish tradition, the concept of *l'dor v'dor*—from generation to generation—underscores the sacred responsibility to honor and care for our elders. Jewish non-profit long-term care facilities embody this value, offering not only medical and personal care but also a deeply rooted sense of community, identity, and spiritual continuity. Through philanthropy, Friends and Supporters of the Bilingual Russian Program have become stewards for community continuity for those who only can speak Russian in their advanced age—ensuring that our elders are not only cared for but also cherished, and that their stories, traditions, and wisdom continue to inspire future generations.

Similar to the overall statistics in Massachusetts, most patients in the Russian Bilingual Program are dually eligible Medicaid and Medicare beneficiaries, with Medicare covering acute care and Medicaid providing payments for room and board, as well as Medicare co-payments and deductibles. Recent study suggests that on average, Medicaid only covers 82% of the true cost of care, and for non-profit organization such as Hebrew Senior Life, this could go as low as 76%. Therefore, supplementing low Medicaid with donations is vital for creating a home like environment and programming. After all, philanthropy, at its heart, is not just about money-it is about love, about making sure our family members and loved one live with joy, respect, and the dignity they deserve. When you give, you are not just helping—you are transforming lives.
