MUSICOLOGIST DAVID COLLINS


Join Musicologist David Collins for a presentation on one of Beverly Sills most well known roles Massenet's Manon.





Opera-Lecture: Salome by Strauss Musicologist erika reitshamer

Set in first-century Galilee, it follows Salome, stepdaughter of Herod Antipas, who dances for the king and demands the head of the prophet Jokanaan (John the Baptist) as her reward. Her obsession leads to a shocking climax, where desire, power, and death collide.


